Emergency Drugs Emergency Drug Guidelines 9 • In children: • Defibrillate at 2 J/kg then 4 J/kg • Give adrenaline 10 micrograms/kg (0.1 mL/kg of 1: 10 000 up to 1 mL) Ventricular tachyarrhythmias in special circumstances Other drugs may be indicated in some special circumstances:

Emergency Drug Guidelines - WHO

Atropine may be given via the endotracheal tube in an emergency; use twice the normal intravenous dose and dilute in 10 ml of 0.9% saline. The paediatric dose is 20 micrograms per kg (to a maximum of 0.5 mg). The onset of action is within 5 minutes and the duration of action is 2 to 4 hours.

Correct hypovolaemia first. Have vasopressors available (eg metaraminol 5-10 mcg/kg). Be careful of propofol in infants <1 year of age dosing is more complex. Propofol is based on approximately: 1-5yo: 2.5-3.5mg/kg, 5-10yo: 2-3 mg/kg, >10: 1.5-2.5 mg/kg.

Use 0.5 mEq/ml for < 6 months. Terbutaline. 10 mcg/Kg SQ q 15 min. 0.1-10 mcg/Kg/min IV. Refractory status. Asthmaticus. Max dose: 0.4 mg. Vasopressin. 0.5 units/Kg IV/IO*.

Emergency Use Authorization for Vaccines to Prevent COVID ...

Routine use of IV fluids, magnesium, corticosteroids, or calcium is not recommended (III-B, IIb-B, III-C, III-B, respectively), but these drugs may be beneficial in specific patient populations. 2,6 Use of these drugs, as well as amiodarone, lidocaine, sodium bicarbonate, reversal agents, and impedance threshold devices are thoroughly covered in the RECOVER guidelines. 2,6

The emergency drugs for cardiac diseases are: Adrenaline (Epinephrine)- Sympathomimetic agent used in Cardiac arrest and emergency treatment

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of allergic reactions (Type I) including anaphylaxis Noradrenaline (Norad)- Catecholamine and inotropic agent used to temporarily correct profound hypotension before fluid replacement therapy can work
